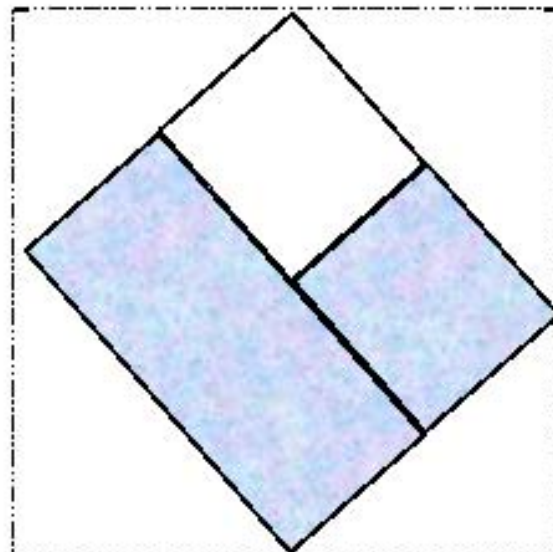
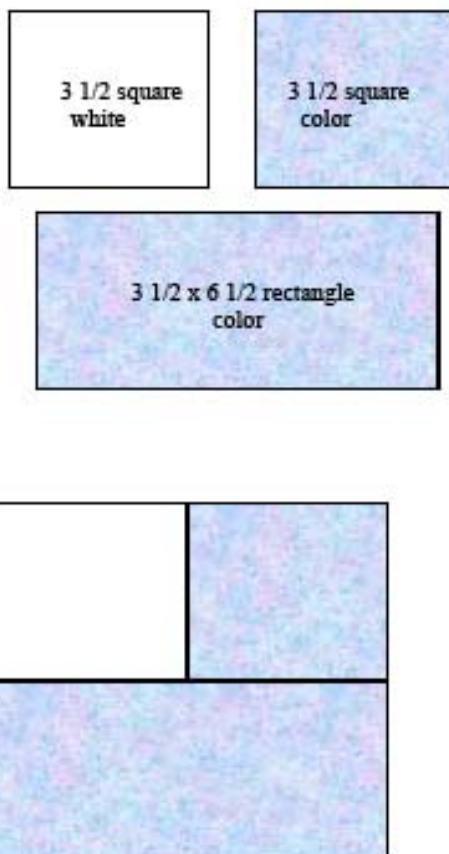

### *FNOG Cancer Heart Block*

Sew one 3 1/2 inch square of white muslin to a 3 1/2 inch square of colored fabric

Sew a 3 1/2 inch x 6 1/2 inch rectangle of colored fabric to first unit

When set on point —it makes a heart



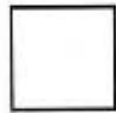

**BATIK STRIP POKER**  
**August 14, 2008**  
**Antelope Valley Quilt Guild**

*Needle Notes*

Strip Poker requires a deck of cards per table. A table usually has 5-6 people (gamblers) at each table (not counting the dealer) More is too much, less is not enough.

Each participant brings 30— 2 and 1/2” strips of quilt shop quality, prewashed, 100% cotton fabric. Cut Width of fabric. 2 1/2” x 42” approximately. Our theme this time will be the BATIKS.

One person is assigned to be the dealer at each table. He or she stays at that table all the time. She or he is responsible to see that only 6 people are at his (her) table

The deck is shuffled between each hand. The deal is always left to right.

Before he/she deals every person at the table (including the dealer) antis up FIVE strips of fabric. Then he/she deals one card, face up to each person, including herself. (Its easier on the dealer to have someone playing for him/her).

The person with the highest card gets first choice from the pile. The next highest card chooses and so on. Do this 6 times.

When all the fabric is traded, contact the team leader. At this point she will ring a bell and everyone gets up and scatters to find another table and does the same thing.

Each person will end up sitting at 6 tables and playing 6 hands at each table not necessarily with the same people. When they get up they go wherever they want.

Not all tables will finish at the exact same time so there can be a little wait at some tables until the bell rings. Dealers should be told to wait until they have correct number of people to make the game fun. MORE FABRIC to choose from.

TIES...Let's say you have a king, a 10, two 7s, a 3 and a 2 in one hand. You have the king choose then the 10 then you deal one card to each of the 7s (in order L-R). Whoever is highest picks first, the other tie person picks next and then you go on to the 3 and 2. The tie has to be resolved before the next one chooses. It does not matter if the cards dealt to resolve the tie are lower than the people next in line. The tie chooses based on the original cards...7s.
